

History

In 1974 at the 65th annual convention of the North Carolina League of Municipalities, a small group of clerks met to discuss the possibility of organizing a statewide association. At the League Board of Directors' meeting in February, 1975, a resolution was adopted approving the organization of the North Carolina Association of Municipal Clerks and authorizing it as an affiliate organization of the League. In the years since its inception, the organization has grown to a membership of more than 500. The Association is governed by a Board of Directors elected from the membership from across the state.

The Association provides continuing opportunities for clerks to gain knowledge and skills that increase effectiveness and efficiency in carrying out their duties.





Educational Opportunities

Annual City/County Clerks' Academy

This three-day conference is held every November and is sponsored by the UNC School of Government.
